A VICTORIOUS HISTORY

The 24 Hours of Le Mans is a world-famous race synonymous with endurance racing, an event rightfully included in motorsport legend.

DREAM TEAM, FERRARI 499P #50

Three drivers, one team, and one Ferrari 499P hypercar with the evocative number 50 on the livery.

Antonio Fuoco: Italian, aged 26. After years in the Ferrari Driver Academy, he made his début in GT racing. Since 2021 he has raced in the WEC, collecting seven podiums and two victories

Miguel Molina: Spaniard, aged 34, his career titles include the 2021 European Le Mans Series. In the WEC from 2017, he has notched up 14 podiums and two victories in 32 races

Nicklas Nielsen: Danish, aged 26, after winning the Ferrari Challenge Trofeo Pirelli (2018), he claimed at least one title in each of the following seasons. In 2022, he was crowned LMP2 Pro-Am world champion

DREAM TEAM, FERRARI 499P #51

Experience is the word that unites the three drivers of the 499P number 51.

Alessandro Pier Guidi: Italian, aged 39, he has three LMGTE Pro Drivers' titles in his trophy cabinet, all won with his British teammate

James Calado: British, aged 33, he won the WEC title in 2017, 2021 and 2022, receiving 12 winners' laurels in seven seasons

Antonio Giovinazzi: Italian, aged 29, he has driven for Scuderia Ferrari since 2017, gaining experience in F1, FE and GT. In 2023, he will make his full-time début in endurance racing with the Prancing Horse Hypercar.

THE RULES THE GAME

The 24 Hours of Le Mans starting grid features many cars from different classes, but all entered with victory as their one goal. Here are a few pointers to follow to recognise the competitors.

RED NUMBER PANELS



This is the top class. The 499P competes in it. It is open to LMH (like Ferrari) and LMDh cars. LMHs are 4WD hybrids with a regulation-limited maximum output of 680 horsepower. LMDhs are 2WD hybrids with a chassis selected from one of four manufacturers.

BLUE NUMBER PANELS



Le Mans Prototypes are closed cockpit cars with no production minimum required. These cars are developed exclusively for on-track competitions, fulfilling the requirements of the Automobile Club de l'Ouest's technical regulations.

ORANGE NUMBER PANELS



The Le Mans Grand Touring Endurance (referred to as LMGTE) category include racing cars derived from street models having an aptitude for sport with 2 doors, 2 or 2+2 seats, open or closed, which can be used perfectly legally on the open road.

THE RULES THE GAME

Hyperpole: to give teams a chance to demonstrate pure speed, the Hyperpole session is for the first six qualifiers in each class only. The outcome determines the top six places in each class on the starting grid

Pit-stop: refuelling generally occurs every 45-50 minutes. A limited number of mechanics can work on the car

Driving stints: as a rule, each driver stays at the wheel for two stints, starting out with a set of new tyres

Safety Car: the track is divided into three distinct sectors, associated with a specific Safety Car that intervenes when necessary. Being in the wrong place can be decisive to the race result

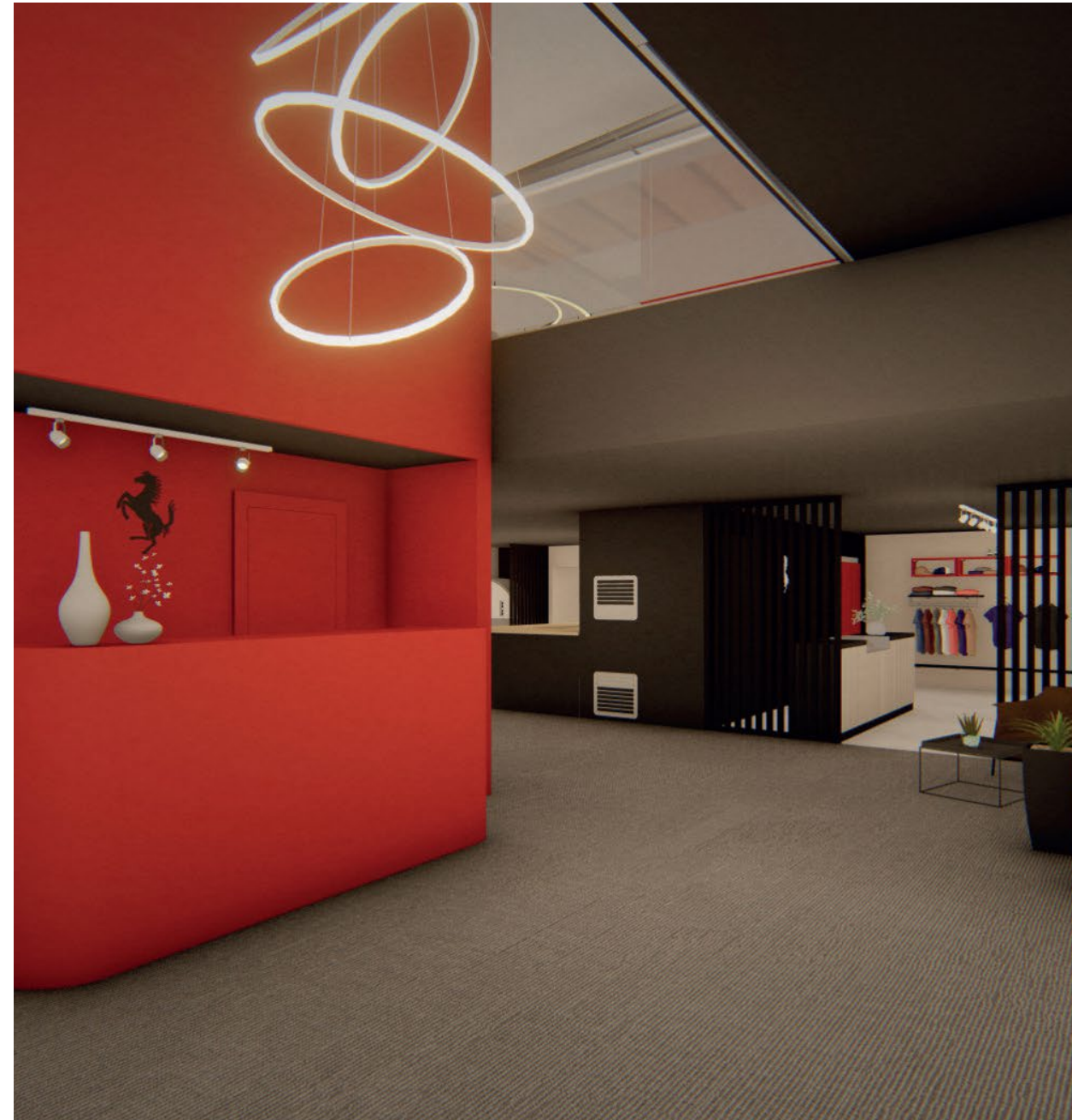
